Children, teens and adults are encouraged to join in on the festivities and read throughout the summer to earn prizes. The program is sponsored by the Friends of the Cerritos Library and the theme this year is "Le Cirque: Reading is Spectacular!"

#### Registration

Online registration will begin Monday, June 10 and runs through Sunday, June 16 on the library's website at [cerritoslibrary.us](http://cerritoslibrary.us), and requires one valid Cerritos Library card per household. Participants who register online need to bring their Cerritos Library card to the Art Studio located in the Children's Library. Each participant must be present to register, or their valid Cerritos Library card must be presented. In addition, each member of the family must be present to claim their grand prize. A separate form will need to be completed for each person who signs up for the program to receive their reading log.

#### Prizes and Programs

Children up to age 11 who read 30 minutes per day are eligible for Summer Reading program prizes. Young adults, ages 12 to 17, and adults, ages 18 and older, must complete four books, either fiction or non-fiction, in any language. Prizes will be distributed while supplies last during the following weeks: Registration Week: June 17-23; June 24-30; July 1-7; July 8-14; and Grand Prize Weeks: July 15-27. In addition, the Summer Reading Program will include various performers, activities and entertainment for the entire family to enjoy. So, enjoy the magic and READ spectacularly! ### READ AWAY YOUR FINES PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN

Youngsters up to age 18 with Cerritos Library fines for overdue books are encouraged to participate in a new Read Away Your Fines program. To participate, children should sign in at the Circulation Desk, read inside the library for at least 30 minutes and then sign out at the Circulation Desk. For every 30 minutes spent reading, staff will remove \$2.50 in fines for overdue age-appropriate books. Adults may read to young children. Children may participate in the program an unlimited number of times. It is not possible to build a credit for future fines. Fines for lost or damaged items, overdue DVDs and overdue CDs are not eligible for the program. The goal of the program is to encourage reading and provide children with a way to regain use of their library cards. For more information, please call (562) 916-1340.

### GRAPHIC NOVELS IN HOOPLA

Now available at Hoopla, browse comics by newest releases, publisher and series to make discovering your next favorite read even easier. Also, check out Action View, Hoopla's reading technology that makes stories come alive. When using the app, double-tap a panel and swipe left for a panel-by-panel guided reading experience. Lastly, Kids Mode empowers kids to explore comics on Hoopla that are made for them. When Kids Mode is activated, Hoopla will only show titles rated safe for kids!

### NOVELIST SELECT

Looking for what to read during the Cerritos Library Summer Reading Program? The Cerritos Library catalog now includes recommendations from NovelList. NovelList Select has been integrated into the Library's eCatalog and is available to use. When a book record is open in the catalog, the lower half of the page will now display content provided by NovelList Select, including other books in the series, read-alikes (similar titles, similar authors and similar series), Story Elements to search for similar books, ratings and reviews pulled from Goodreads, Lexile Measure and related content, such as awards, book lists and Novelist articles.

### MOBILE PRINTING NOW OFFERED

The Cerritos Library now offers an online Mobile Print Center. Patrons can upload their print jobs from any location with internet access and print their documents from the Cerritos Library's printers. Printing options include letter, legal and tabloid size paper, black-and-white, color, double-sided and multiple copies. The costs to print per side are \$.10 for letter or legal-size paper in black-and-white; \$.45 for letter or legal-size paper in color; \$.15 for tabloid-size paper in black-and-white; and \$.65 for tabloid-size paper in color.

To access the Cerritos Library's Mobile Print Center, go to [print.cerritoslibrary.us](http://print.cerritoslibrary.us) and log in by typing your Library Card or Computer and Print Card Number in the box under Username and entering your card's PIN in the box under Password. If you use the default PIN, it is recommended that you reset it to a personalized PIN. You can reset your PIN at a Computer Signup Station located in the Print Center on the library's second floor or at the Internet Express location on the first floor in the Craftsman area. To upload a file, press the Upload button in the Job List window. Then, locate your file on your computer or mobile device, click on the file name, make sure it is highlighted and click on the Open button. Once submitted, a print job will stay in the print queue for two hours before being erased. You can add funds to your print center account from a credit or debit card or with a PayPal account. To print the job, go to the Print Center located on the second floor of the library. Swipe your Library Card or Computer and Print Card through the card swiper on the printer. The screen on the printer will display the names of the print jobs in your queue and the cost to print each job.
