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My favorite national is Yellow Stone. On day 3, we went to Mammoth Hot Springs which was mostly white and had some streams. Scientists predict that 90 percent of the water comes from the ground and the other 10 percent will flow above the ground it is special because the landscape changes over time and there is infinite water flow. After we went to Mammoth hot springs we went to Norris. Norris is famous because at Norris they have the tallest geyser. It is called the. Steamboat geyser, when the steamboat geyser erupts a geyser called cistern gets drained. When we were going back to our car my friend's mom flew right next to a geyser called emerald geyser, so the dads had to get a stick to get the cap.
